

Founded in 1889 in Geneva, the Inter-Parliamentary Union is the global organization of national parliaments and regional parliamentary assemblies which has 166 members and 10 associate members. Its mission is to promote peace, security, democracy and human rights through political dialogue.

The Villa Gardiol (1908), restored to its original condition, is set aside for reception purposes. Its extension, in the form of a plinth located in the wooded park, houses the foyer, common areas and conference rooms. The project presented in the design competition was reworked several times in order to comply with a design-to-cost approach.
